

Microsoft Edge

Changing the size of text on screen

 You can zoom in / out of Microsoft Edge pages to make reading more comfortable for you.



- 1. Click on the 3 dots in Microsoft Edge
- 2. Click the + or to zoom in/out, or the diagonal arrow to enter full screen
- You can also use keyboard shortcuts to zoom in / out


Press this	To do this
Ctrl + plus sign (+)	Zoom in (25%)
Ctrl + minus sign (-)	Zoom out (25%)
Ctrl + zero (0)	Reset zoom level to 100%
Ctrl + Scroll wheel up	Zoom in
Ctrl + Scroll wheel down	Zoom out
F11	Toggle between full screen and exit full screen






Magnify your screen


- You can use the magnifier in Windows to enlarge part or all of your screen to enable to you see words/images better
- Go to start (on your taskbar) → settings → ease of access




• Select "magnifier" on the menu on the left hand side



Toggle magnifier to "on" and adjust the zoom settings



 A small pop up box will also appear on screen allowing you to easily zoom in/out as required









Read Aloud

Microsoft Edge has the functionality to read aloud web pages to you.






- Use the grey bar at the top to pause/play the read aloud
- 4. Click the voice options to adjust the speed or change the voice



Immersive reader

- The immersive reader function in Microsoft Edge allows you to read webpages with fewer distractions. You can change the theme and text size to suit you.
- This function is only available on **some** webpages currently



- 4. To exit immersive reader mode click the icon in the address bar again
- You can also use keyboard shortcuts to access immersive reader mode on webpages where this feature is accessible. Press F9 to enter / exit immersive reader.







General Microsoft Accessibility Features

Change contrast settings


- Higher contrast settings can make the screen easier to read for some colleagues
- Go to start (on your taskbar) → settings → ease of access



Select "high contrast" on the menu on the left hand side



 Toggle high contrast to "on" and use the features here to customise your set up









Change cursor settings


- Make your cursor stand out and more visible by changing it's colour and size
- Go to start (on your taskbar) → settings → ease of access



• Select "cursor and pointer" on the menu on the left hand side



Change the colour and size to suit your preferences








Colour filters


- You can apply colour filters to your screen to enable you to see images, text, and colours more easily
- Go to start (on your taskbar) → settings → ease of access



• Select "colour filters" on the menu on the left hand side



• Toggle colour filters to "on" and select your preference of colour filter








Narrator

- You can use the narrator function in Windows which acts as a screen reader to help you navigate your device
- To turn on narrator go to start (on your task bar) → settings → ease of access



• Select "narrator" on the menu on the left hand side



• Toggle narrator to "on"
