

January 2020 Summary Health & Safety Performance Report

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Executive Summary

AFR:

- The Major Projects 12 month rolling AFR to January 2020 remained at 0.06.
- There was **1 RIDDOR** accident reported in January 2020.
- **0 RIDDORs** fell out of the scope of the rolling AFR calculation.
- The in-month AFR was **0.07** and the net 12 month recorded hours increased by 0.32% (20.03 to 20.09m).
- The Operations 12 month rolling AFR to January 2020 increased from 0.07 to 0.08.
- There were **3 RIDDOR** accidents reported in January 2020.
- 1 RIDDOR fell out of the scope of the rolling AFR calculation.
- The in-month AFR was 0.20 and the net 12 month recorded hours increased by 0.30% (20.05 to 20.11m).
- The overall Supply Chain 12 month rolling AFR to January 2020 increased from 0.06 to 0.07.
- There have been **29 RIDDORs** in the rolling 12-month period.
- 1 RIDDOR fell out of the scope of the rolling AFR calculation.
- The in-month AFR was **0.13** and the net 12 month recorded hours increased by 0.31% (40.08 to 40.20m).

Lost time Incidents:

- There have been 9 Lost Time Incidents reported this month - 2 Major Projects, 5 Operations and 2 Highways England.

Fatality Data:

The National Incident Liaison Officer (NILO), media and police reports provide information on the number of fatalities on the strategic road network. These data sources indicated that there had been 15 fatal incidents and 3 suicides on the Strategic Road Network.

- There have been 4 RIDDOR reportable events in January.

Service Strikes:

- There have been 5 service strikes reported this month

Vehicle Incursions:

- There have been 166 Vehicle Incursions reported this month

IPV Strikes

- There has been 1 IPV Strike reported this month

- There have been **0** Bridge Strike reported this month

Site Inspections:

- To date there have been 38 inspections carried out for January 2020 by the H&S Division, 25 in Major Projects and 13 in Operations




Graph 1 – Rolling AFR for Supply Chain - Major Projects








Graph 2 – Rolling AFR for Supply Chain - Operations







Road User Performance and Road User Safety

- We have revised our **Suicide Prevention Toolkit** the central hub for knowledge, policy, guidance and resources for identifying and delivering a broad and inclusive range of crisis interventions on the network. This has now been peered reviewed by Samaritans, academics and internal partners. The Toolkit alongside wider supporting documents have been published and associated communication activities are planned throughout February. We continue to develop our understanding of suicides on our network through better tools to analyse clusters sites and contributory factors (i.e. environmental factors, nearby hospitals and schools), this includes academic research being undertaken with Middlesex University to further understand the reasons why someone may choose the road network as a means of suicides and factors that may discourage them.
- Road User Safety Campaigns: we re-ran our vehicle checks campaign which encourages families to check their vehicles before long journeys using tv, radio, out of home and digital advertising. We have completed work to develop our next campaign focusing on driving to the conditions and rain, the campaign will look to get drivers to re-evaluate the risks and to take extra care. Our research shows that rain is a factor in 1 in 7 fatalities on our network in 2018 and that there were 268 incidents of people being killed or seriously injured in collisions in the rain. The launch of the campaign is planned for February, however, this dependent on wider public relation and media activities.



• **Driving for Better Business** continues to increase its reach with 700,000 drivers now positively influenced through organisations registered with the programme. New registrations this month include the Department for Work and Pensions, Northumbrian Water and National Express. The new approach for the communications programme since May last year has seen 31 pieces of UK coverage secured, with coverage sentiment 100% positive and 2,368,522 UK readers reached. **DfBB** held the first **National Work-related Road Risk Development Group** which comprised representatives from **DfT**, Traffic Commissioners, Van Excellence, Driver Vehicle Standards Agency, HSE and other key influencers. The two key purposes of this group are to identify common and recurring work-related risk on the network and to develop mitigation measures which can be delivered through this wider forum.





Road User Performance and Road User Safety – continued.

We supported the delivery of an enhanced **load security** capability in the North West, courses have been delivered by HSE, regional Police Forces and Driver Vehicle Standards Agency. Over 150 officers are now trained in the North-West region. Various offences have been detected on engagement and compliance days including no straps in use to secure loads, poor condition of ratchet straps, Hazardous Chemical loads not being secured in vehicles, tyre offences, over loading of vehicles and driving hour offences.









Health, Safety & Wellbeing Team Update

- a) The new Health, Safety and Wellbeing (HSW) intranet page was published on the 9th December, this was supported with <u>a number of</u> communications across the organisation. The HSW landing page incorporates the short animation introducing the Health & Safety Management System (HSMS), what it is, where to find it and the benefits to the user. There is a dedicated section which sets out the HSMS content in an A-Z index. The first of the new documents have been published as part of this initial phase.
- b) **Wellbeing calendar of campaigns and initiatives**; has been produced and is being shared across the business to ensure directorate activity aligns with corporate initiatives. This enables teams/leaders to keep wellbeing in the fore front of people's minds and provides our people with tools, information, and signposting to enable them to improve their health and wellbeing
- c) **New Occupational health contract awarded**; this will start on 1st April 2020. The new contract will provide better support and guidance to give help prevent and manage absence.
- d) Increased visibility of sickness absence data; this is a key health and wellbeing metric and forms a pivotal part of the HR dashboard.
