## **Executive Summary**

#### **Accident Frequency Rate (AFR) Overview:**

- The Major Projects 12 month rolling AFR to October 2019 increased from 0.05 to 0.07.
- There were **3 RIDDOR** accidents reported in October 2019.
- **0 RIDDORs** fell out of the scope of the rolling AFR calculation.
- The in-month AFR was **0.16** and the net 12 month recorded hours increased by 1.89% (19.1m to 19.46m).
- The Operations 12 month rolling AFR to October 2019 remained at 0.05.
- There were 2 RIDDOR accidents reported in October 2019.
- 2 RIDDORs fell out of the scope of the rolling AFR calculation.
- The in-month AFR was **0.11** and the net 12 month recorded hours decreased by 0.86% (20.36 to 20.19m).
- The overall Supply Chain 12 month rolling AFR to October 2019 increased from 0.05 to 0.06.
- There have been **24 RIDDORs** in the rolling 12-month period.
- 2 RIDDORs fell out of the scope of the rolling AFR calculation.
- The in-month AFR was **0.14** and the net 12 month recorded hours decreased by 0.47% (39.46 to 39.64m).

#### Lost time Incidents:

- There have been 9 Lost Time Incidents reported this month - 3 in Major Projects, 6 in Operations and 0 in TO/RCC

## **Incidents Reported:**

- There have been **6 RIDDOR** events (including **1** RIDDOR Dangerous Occurrence) reported in October.

## Service Strikes:

- There have been 14 service strikes reported this month).

## Vehicle Incursions:

- There have been 159 Vehicle Incursions reported this month

#### **IPV Strikes**

- There have been 3 IPV Strikes reported this month

## **Bridge Strikes:**

- There has been 1 Bridge Strike reported this month

#### Site Inspections:




# **Graph 1 – Rolling AFR for Supply Chain - Major Projects**








# **Graph 2 – Rolling AFR for Supply Chain - Operations**






## Vehicle incursions into roadworks





# **Road User Performance and Road User Safety**

• Our Regional Safety Coordinators continue to deliver a range activities, including: supporting our partners and key stakeholders delivering a range of events to support Tyre Safety Month, this has included using digital tyre scanner kits at motorway services areas which allow a deeper level of engagement on vehicle checks and the need for regular tyre inspections with our customers; we have worked in collaboration with one of our key stakeholders DPD to support their inaugural road safety event which looked to educate drivers, pedestrians and cyclists on how to reduce their risk of being involved in a collision with a HGV; and we are working with Suffolk Constabulary who have established a Commercial Vehicle Unit to undertake joint compliance operations on our network, a recent operation on the A14 Ipswich checked over fifty vehicles with offences from drivers hour to no insurance and driving licence detected.









- We held a **Commercial Vehicle Safety Conference** at Haydock Park racecourse on 2 October. Over 90 delegates attended the day and discussed a broad range of issues from the role of new technologies, compliance checks and health and wellbeing issues facing drivers. The speakers included representatives from the North West Commercial Vehicle Policing Unit, Health & Safety Executive, Manchester University and an ex-HGV driver who spoke about his personal story following a fatal collision where he was jailed for causing death by dangerous driving.
- As part of our **Red X Signal Enforcement Programme** we have now completed the upgrade of 32 camera sites across the network, these are now being tested and evidence provided to police enforcement authorities that the cameras are ready for go-live. Our plan was to commence red x camera enforcement to start mid-October in Avon & Somerset, followed shortly after by Surrey, Essex and Kent with associated advanced communications and publicity activity including a national news release and media activity. The launch of Red X has been slightly delayed due to additional Home Office Type Approval's for a Redflex HADECS 3X SmartView+ software upgrade which to confirms the outputs to enforcement interfaces and provides additional functionality to support enforcement. Home Office have confirmed that expected approval of the system upgrade will be in place by 11 November, with enforcement scheduled to commence from 23 November.







## **Road User Performance and Road User Safety – continued.**

- Suicide Prevention we are delivering a comprehensive programme of work with our key stakeholders and partners to reduce the high incidence of suicides on our network in the North West. Preliminary assessments have been conducted at ten frequently used locations (some with multiple bridges) which have had more than 25 suicide events recorded in the period from 2016-2018. Samaritans posters have been placed at all these overbridges and these are gradually being upgraded to the latest crisis signs, we are also installing further signs at other high frequency locations. In most of the high frequency locations the appropriate mitigation measures are to install higher parapets. Feasibility work is already underway at seven bridges on the M60 and M56 with detailed and implementation programmed for next year. Due to structural and operational constraint's, we are also looking to introduce pedestrian detection and camera systems where appropriate, i.e. M60 Barton Bridge. In addition to our programme of asset improvements we are working closely with local stakeholder groups across the whole region to ensure we are part of a multi-agency approach.
- We supported the development and delivery of a **Parliamentary Advisory Council for Transport Safety Conference** on Post Crash Response. The conference featured practitioners, politicians and researchers involved in specifying and delivering these vital services and looked at how improvements could be made to optimise patient outcomes, learn from the events and to support victims' families. At the conference we provide an overview of our approach to Post Crash Response through our CLEAR initiative (Collision Lead Evaluate Act Re-open). Building on this conference and wider research we are reviewing our approach to Post Crash Response and will report our findings in early 2020.
- Following the National Public-Sector Summit at the House of Commons in January, **Driving for Better Business (DfBB)** joined with the Police and Crime Commissioner for Devon and Cornwall to host a regional summit for both public and private sector organisations in the South West. The event was attended by over 75 organisations and focused on how DfBB can help to reduce the considerable pressure on the human and financial resources, both internally managing our own fleets, and externally, in dealing with road incidents that involve those who use our roads for work. The call to action encouraged all organisations in the South West to come together to lead the way forward as a region contributing to safe and compliant at work drivers.





## **National Health & Safety Team Update**

- a) Corporate Inductions: The Health & Safety team are currently only one of two teams who provide a representative to lead their part of the company corporate induction (the other being Customer). From December 2019, this one hour slot will be extended to two hours, and include road user safety (including driving on smart motorways) and safety risk requirements. We're currently working with colleagues in Learning & Development to consider options to extend this up to a half-day session on safety, health and wellbeing in their broadest sense.
- b) Home Safe & Well Corporate actions: We have undertaken a process known as logic mapping for each of the corporate activities. This helps us ensure that the planned actions planned will meet the intended objective. This has proved valuable for improvements in one of the corporate activities ('Tools & Equipment') so far, and we'll be working through our Home Safe and Well champions to apply logic mapping outputs to the rest of the corporate activities.
- c) Safety Alerts: There were 3 Safety Alerts issued in the month:

HEi120 - Highways England Safety Alert - Wire rope breakage

HEi121 - Highways England Safety Alert - Taper strike resulting in RIDDOR injury to TM operative

HEi122 - Highways England Safety Alert - Finger trapped in swivel shackle resulting in fracture
