The National Incident Liaison Officer (NILO), Media and Police Reports provide some understanding on the number of fatalities on the strategic road network. Based on our current understanding there are 18 fatalities due to road traffic collisions and 5 suspected suicides in May. The historic number of fatalities in the month of May for 2017 – 2019, indicates that the average number of fatalities was 23.7 and suspected suicides was 3.7. The locations of the fatal collisions and suspected suicides are plotted on maps of the SRN, red markers indicate a fatal collision during May and yellow markers are the previous 11 months on a rolling total.

MP-0169: M27 J4-11	Ian McMillan	Management Arrangements	McCann and the project have been awarded a blue star for their innovative Cat & Genny training. Sub-contractor McCann has had service strikes on the project and through investigation identified knowledge, skills and experience gaps on the practical use of CAT and Genny in the workforce.  McCann have implemented a training programme which has significantly improved competence and confidence, in the use of Cable Avoidance Tools (CAT), with a focus on the use of the Signal Generator (Genny).  The programme will improve operative's ability to identify buried services and in turn will reduce service strikes.  Since running the programme, McCann have been monitoring data through the CAT manager and have seen a clear and significant increase in the competent use of CAT and Genny.  This programme is now being rolled out across the project, to ensure competence and confidence of CAT and Genny users.





#### **Road User Performance and Road User Safety**

**Driving on England's motorways guides** – Following engagement with Eurotunnel, there were concerns around distribution of the physical guides due to the pandemic. As a result, we worked with Eurotunnel to deliver the information electronically through a safety campaign via Eurotunnel's vast contact database and provided links to Eurotunnel for publication on their <u>website</u> as well as working to deliver a joint message. The message was sent on 6 May 2021 in <u>English</u> and <u>French</u> to 5,200 contacts from 22 different countries as well as being sent separately to all French speaking countries in Europe comprising over 1,100 contacts. This has enabled Highways England to have a wider reach in Europe to inform drivers to drive safely on our road network. The guides are available physically and electronically, with the electronic version being available in 15 languages which can be located <u>here.</u> The guides contain key safety messages for our overseas goods vehicle customers - as well as for drivers that are living in England but who do not have English as their primary language. The guides have been distributed to DVSA, Police, traffic officers, ferry companies, truck stops and a number of fleet operators.

- Our Regional Safety Coordinators continue to deliver a range of activities including My Red Thumb Day (May 12<sup>th</sup>), which is a multi-agency road safety campaign designed to raise awareness of the risks of using a mobile phone while driving: <a href="https://www.facebook.com/watch/?v=933666734115784">https://www.facebook.com/watch/?v=933666734115784</a>. Following Operation Brigantia, a region-wide commercial vehicle operation focussing on load security that ran for 2 weeks in April the results showed over the 2 weeks 626 vehicles were checked with 258 drivers receiving a Traffic Offence Report, summons or verbal warning for load security is sues, a further 186 offences were also dealt with including an arrest for a cloned vehicle identified in Northumbria. We ran a compliance event (21 May 2021) with Kent Police and DVSA at Medway Services on the M2. 14 vehicles were stopped, all except one were commercial vehicles. Offences included exceeding driver hours, no insurance, tax or MOTs, unroadworthy tyres and unsecured loads. Both DVSA and Kent Police are keen to do something similar another time, probably at STOP24 Services on the M20.
- We issued a <u>Safety Alert on Tailgating</u> on 12<sup>th</sup> May. We are currently trialling detection technology to identify tailgating and nudge road users to change their behaviour through early interventions comprising warning letters and educational material. The purpose of this alert is to raise awareness of tailgating and the associated safety risks, to Highways England staff and our Supply Chain. Initial feedback from the area team has been positive including an opportunity to trail some tech and a company has contacted us to discuss a collaboration with 'Operation Ping'.







#### Road User Performance and Road User Safety – continued.

Driving for Better Business – After 2 years of engagement, the Crown Commercial Services announced in May a mandatory
requirement in the procurement of specific services in relation to the supply and fit of tyres and associated service (Tyres/Glass and
fast fit solutions). They have now mandated for all awarded suppliers to sign up to the DfBB Programme as part of the Social Value
initiative. This is the first but significant step in the relationship and the DfBB team will be working to get similar mandates in other
areas associated with fleets and work-related road risk procurements.
