

● Non-RIDDOR - Specified Injury









Departives were on a work platform in the Gwent back-span fitting one of the Beeche beam clamps to a transverse beam, in accordance with their method statement and procedures. An operative assisting with fitting one of the clamps secured the clamp jaws with pins in positions that had been ideal on the previous beam, believing that this secured the clamp on the beam.

The jaw of the clamp came free from the lower beam flange unexpectedly, allowing the clamp to drop and pivot around the jaw end that was still engaged with the flange. The operative's left ring finger was in the space between

the clamp jaw and the lower flange of the beam, causing a serious crushing injury to the fingertip.





Red X HADECS Enforcement Programme

Safe speed, safe vehicles and safe people

Our programme for upgrading all 95 HADECS speed cameras to additional Red X enforcement capability has been completed ahead of the September 2022 target date. In addition, there are a further 39 new scheme cameras installed, with another 24 to follow giving a final total of 158 Red X/speed motorway enforcement cameras. Training in Red X offence capture has been provided to all Police forces and there are now 13 forces enforcing Red X, as well as speed, offences. This is fully aligned to the government's Stocktake Action 14 commitments and provides a significant measure in further improving motorway safety.

Partnership and Collaboration - Isle of Wight Festival drink/drive event

Safe people

We attended Portsmouth and Southampton ports to work in collaboration with Fire and Rescue, Police, and Local Authority colleagues from the Hampshire Safer Roads Partnership to deliver "morning after drink-drive" advice to people crossing to the Isle of Wight to attend the annual music festival. Around 12,500 people engaged with us across the ports. We handed out cards with information on the amount of time various alcoholic drinks take to pass from your system and a QR code linking to a website that calculates roughly when you'll be safe to drive after drinking. Although this event has been delivered on a smaller scale in previous years, this year saw a much better turn out from partners, and a significant rise in the number of interactions. The message was a simple one, have a great time at the festival, but think about when you need to stop drinking the day before you plan to drive home again.



Combined Breakdown Letters Project / Fuel Related Breakdowns on SRN Scoping Study

Safe People

The objective of this project is to gather intelligence & behavioural insights of customers who break down on the SRN and conduct a fuel related breakdown study. This project will primarily allow us to gather intelligence on road user experience following a recent breakdown, including demographic insight and the circumstances which lead to the unplanned stop - i.e. causation factors and the actions they took. The intelligence and insights will be evaluated to help understand key issues that led to breakdowns and our customers knowledge / experience in managing the situation safely. This evidence will inform how we can better assist our customers, to both prevent the breakdown but also manage these incidents in the safest way. The fuel-related break down study will consider behavioural insights and look at ways of potentially improving our intelligence to identify what interventions and guidance National Highways can provide to address incidents and breakdowns related to our customers running out of fuel when travelling on the SRN.

To date 866 breakdown letters have been processed. The first 465 letters have generated 38 survey responses, however the next 401 letters will start arriving on doorsteps soon.

Commercial Vehicle Show 2022

Safe vehicles and safe people

The Commercial Vehicle Incident Prevention team represented National Highways at the Commercial Vehicle Show 2022 at the NEC between the 24-26 May 2022. Over three days we received and spoke with 553 visitors. Many new contacts were made at the event, one example being an *Independent* journalist who approached the National Highways stand with an interest in the HGV Operation Tramline cab. After discussions with the team he was booked in to go out with Central Motorway Police Group as part of Operation Vertebrae on Friday 17th June. In addition to the main National Highways stand, Driving for Better Business also exhibited, and both complemented each other very well, resulting in a stream of visitors being directed between the two stands. The primary focus for DfBB was to connect with Fleet Managers and others involved in work related road risk to get them registered with the programme and raise awareness of the new company portal and the resources available. Over 3 days we engaged with over 150 new fleet contacts. These contacts covered a large range of roles within organisations including; Directors, Operation Managers, Transport and Fleet Managers and Customer Experience leads. Work is now ongoing to liaise further with these contacts to consolidate and enhance the relationship.

Improving collaboration

Safe vehicles and safe people

Key engagements in June include; Octopus Energy Services, Leeds City Council and National Grid - with FORS (Sopra Stevia) and The Driver Handbook confirmed as new partners. Throughout May and June DfBB has promoted sustainability as the main theme. Paul Kirby, founder of EV café and founder of consulting and training firm EV Essentials and one of the best-known experts on electric LCV's with over 30 years in the automotive sector, took part in Let's Talk Fleet Risk. Our supporting partners Logistics UK and Webfleet promoted a series of 3 webinars as part of Logistics UK Decarbonisation Initiative - Focusing on sustainability in your fleet for significant business benefits.

Partnership and Collaboration - Operation Vertebrae

Safe people, safe vehicles

In the North-West region we have partnered with Lancashire, Merseyside, Cheshire, the NW Motorway Commercial Vehicle Unit, local road safety partnerships and the HMRC to deliver Operation Vertebrae along the M6. The unmarked HGV cabs were used as part of a multi-agency week of action on the M6 to reduce the number of incidents on the motorway. The fatal 5 behaviours - mobile phone use, drink drug driving, speed, seatbelts and careless and inconsiderate driving - were the focus for activity. The Regional Safety Programme Manager and a Traffic Officer also presented at the Greater Manchester Safer Driving Seminar which attracted delegates from across the 10 boroughs. Information was shared on the National Highways campaigns, what to do if you breakdown on the network and the role of the Traffic Officer.
